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歴史実証的に研究するには、第一次資料（原資料）に基づいて研究することが求められる。設定した研究課題にどのような第一次資料があるかは、現在ではインターネットの発達によって、かなり自由に活用することができるようになった。大学や図書館や各種団体は、アーカイブスにどのような資料や文書を所蔵しているかを公表しているところが多くなったからである。

インターネットが発達する以前の原資料や大量に発行されたパンフレットとか書簡の収集は極めて困難であった。イギリス大学拡張研究史に即して言えば、大英図書館蔵書目録の著者索引から探す、先達の研究者が編集している文献目録や過去の雑誌の書評欄から文献資料を探す、あるいは直接にアーカイブスに手紙を出すとか、同じ研究をしている者同士での交信により情報交換をする必要があった。

現在は、そうした苦労をあまりしなくても、インターネットでアーカイブスの資料を検索することができるが多くなったので大変便利な時代であるが、実際に資料を入手するのは難しい。事例を示しておこう。ケンブリッジ大学拡張資料にどのようなものがあるかを知りたいければ、インターネットで Archives of the Board of Extra-Mural Studies と入力すればアクセスできる。そこには、University/BEMS contains として、1 から 52 までに分類した項目が並んでいる。45 は Workers' Educational Association 1904-1947 と書いてあるので、ここにはケンブリッジが所蔵している WEA 関係の資料が蔵書されていることがわかる。しかし、どのような個々の資料がそこに蔵書されているかは、ライブラリアンが持つ必携で調べる必要がある。必携を見ると、45 は 1-6 までに中区分されて記載されている。45/6 は 1904-1942 の Reports and minutes of local associations と表題が付けられていて、この題目のもとに複数の報告書や議事録が含まれていることがわかる。インターネットでたどれるのはここまでで、後は実際に現物を見て必要な資料であるかどうかを判断するしかない。

もっとも、アーカイブスごとに分類の仕方や表記は多少違うもので、分類表記で具体的な資料名が公表されているところもある。たとえば大学拡張運動の最初の動きを作った団体は北部イングランド女性高等教育振興協議会であった。この団体の資料は、ケンブリッジのニューナム・カレッジのアーカイブスと、ロンドンの私立女性図書館でフォーセット図書館に現物があるのを確認したが、そのコピーはマンチェスター大学図書館の特別コレクションとして保存されている。また、同協議会の会長ジョセフィン・バトラーの資料は、リバプール大学図書館の特別コレクション（ジョセフィン・バトラー・コレクション）に

も集められている。同コレクションの Personal Papers には 609 点の書簡等の資料、またアーカイブスの特別コレクションでバトラー夫人の著作やパンフレットが 321 点所蔵されており、それぞれに分類番号と書誌がフルに記載されている。このようにアーカイブス資料がインターネットで検索できるようになったのは、研究上便利この上ないことである。

ここに掲げる「労働者教育資料コレクションのリスト、1881-1975 年」は、本誌第 8 号 (2012 年 10 月号) で告知したように、ある労働組合から購入したパンフレットを中心にした資料のリストである。この労働者教育関係のパンフレットは、現物資料であるので独立して取り上げ、各資料に書誌事項と棚番号を付けて公表することにした。書誌事項がついていれば、関心のある人は他のアーカイブでも入手可能になると思われる。それぞれの資料に香川コレクションとして独自の棚番号が付けてあるが、内容から分類して、次のような表題のもとに区分して提示してある。

1. 労働者教育の在り方 (W.1)
2. 労働者教育団体の運営 (W.2)
3. 労働者教育の内容 (W.3)
4. 大学拡張講座 (W.4)
5. 雑誌 (W.5)
6. 成人教育、社会運動、その他 (W.6)

6. 成人教育、社会運動、その他の区分には、労働者教育全般、労働党、社会主義運動、女性運動、成人教育等の領域の資料が一括してまとめられている。排列は、時代状況にあわせて横断的に検索できるように、年代順に記載されている。刊行年が不記載の資料はそれぞれの区分の末尾に一括し、著者をアルファベット順に記載した。前掲論文で各区分ごとに所蔵点数を上げておいたが、一部であるが 3 の他の区分に移動させたものもある。今回はリストの公開であって、複写提供の規則はまだ未制定である。
